Liberty graduated in 2015 with a BA in Economics from Kabale University, Uganda. He is now working as an Accountant for a tour company.

Liberty's parent both died of HIV/AIDS within a year of each other when he was 5 years old. Liberty and his sister Flavia were taken in by their grandmother and their aunt paid their school fees for as long as she could. She was able to support him to get to school but could not afford to see him through university too. That is when Rafiki Thabo stepped in and we were pleased to pay his fees to complete a Bachelors degree in Economics.

Liberty is now living in Kampala and working as an Accountant for a tour company and has recently got engaged.

He is now able to pay his bills and also has some money left over to help others. He now sends money home to his extended family so that the school fees of



children in the family are paid. Through the church he also undertakes community sensitisation on fighting corruption from community grass roots and encourages and gives information to children in the church to help them stay in school and benefit from their education.
