Edgar is a banker in Uganda, a job he would have never been able to aspire to without his degree. He graduated in 2017 with a degree in Business Administration (Accounting) from Mbarara University. Rafiki Thabo Foundation started supporting him in 2014.

Edgar's father, a teacher, was involved in a motor accident which left him in a wheelchair and unable to work. Edgar's mother is a housewife and the family struggled to find the funds for university fees. He soon lost all hope of continuing his education to the higher level that he was so capable of.

In 2014 Rafiki Thabo Foundation were able to step in and help Edgar realise his dream of attending university. After three years, he graduated with a degree specialising in Accounting and he soon landed a job working as a banker for one of the banks in the region. Not only did his university education allow him the chance of a job at this level, but Edgar also really appreciated the opportunity it gave him to be exposed to a more diverse group of people.
