We are supporting Wycliff to study Business Studies at Bishop Barham University in Uganda. We started supporting him in 2019.

Wycliff had everything stacked against him: he was born with polio, leaving him with a disfigured leg, and then lost both his parents when he was a child. But he refuses to give up hope for a brighter future and does not let his disability prevent him from doing anything.

Wycliff lost his mother when he was eight years old: she fell ill and the family did not have enough money to send her to hospital for treatment. She was one of Wycliff's father's three wives. His father died just before Wycliff completed primary school.

Wycliff managed to find a way to complete secondary school, thanks to the support of friends and well wishers. His dream was to get to university but he had no chance of mustering enough fees for that. He was at
