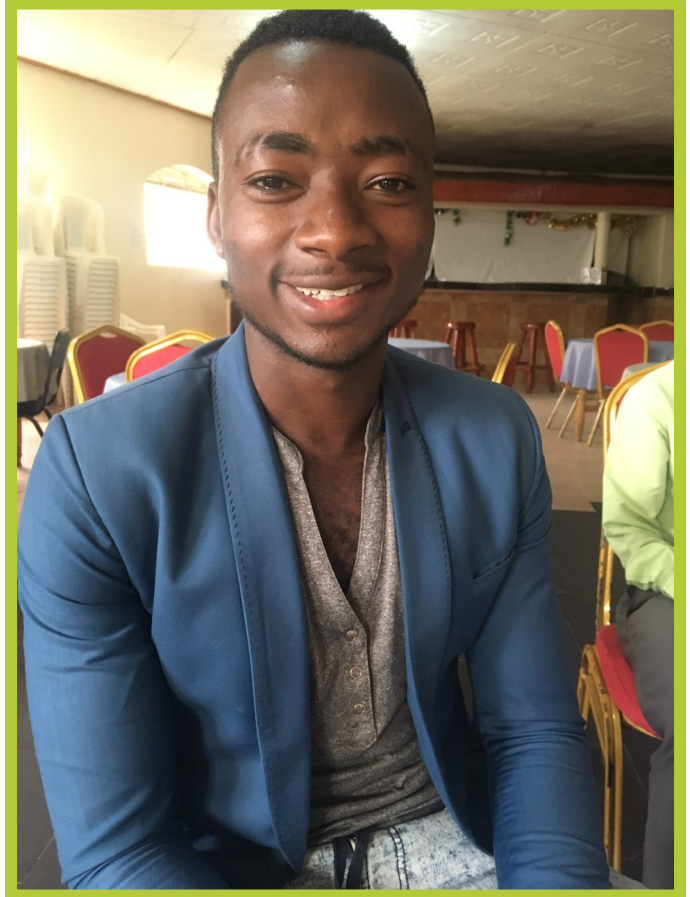


# Delick's Story

Delick graduated in 2018 with a Diploma in Information Technology from Kabale University in Uganda. He now works for a foundation that aims to transform teenagers' lives.

Delick grew up with his mother and six siblings after his father abandoned the family when he was 12 years old. Since then his mother has been working hard as a peasant farmer and casual labourer trying to provide for her children. Delick and his siblings would take on casual work to help put food on the table and raise money for school fees. Delick also worked hard at school to earn an academic bursary to cover his fees, and won the role of school prefect. This gave Delick the confidence to keep pursuing his education despite his mother pleading with him to return home to work. In 2016, with Rafiki Thabo's support, he was able to fulfil his dream of attending university. Delick is first person in his household to have attended secondary school—let alone university!

While Delick was desperate to undertake a full university degree when he graduated with his diploma, he decided instead to find a paid job to help his siblings with food and support towards their education.

He believes that his current job as a helper in a foundation for teens gives him the opportunity to commence his dream of giving back to society. His drive and determination are evident, and he has already had a number of ideas of how he might work with other Rafiki Thabo graduates to raise funds for education for the poorest children in Kabale in order that he may help those that are in need as he once was.

To support Delick cost Rafiki Thabo Foundation £560 per year
